3.2. The Finance and Governance Committee at its last meeting agreed to ask Council to appoint a councillor to attend the Kettering Urban Local Area Partnership (LAP). This LAP, which covers Kettering Town, Burton Latimer and Barton Seagrave, is one of seven LAPs covering the whole of North Northamptonshire. Their role is to support the Health and Wellbeing Board in delivering priorities under the Integrated Care System, a structured arrangement which brings together all relevant agencies whose function is to improve quality of life, (e.g. social care, health, housing, voluntary sector, community safety etc). The ICS is part of a national roll out seeking to join up spending agencies more fully than before to work on shared priorities. The clerk has been attending these meetings whilst they were being set up. North Northamptonshire Council members are automatically invited to these meetings already. The meetings happen every two months during the day time. The priority areas identified by the Kettering LAP is. Community Mental Health & Wellbeing, focusing on 5 - 25 years and Engagement with Youth Population. Over time, priorities will change according to greatest need. The clerk can brief an appointed member prior to their first attendance.
