	The Mayor reminded members of the Holocaust memorial day event on 26 <sup>th</sup> January, at 2pm, in the Manor House Museum Gardens.
	She asked members to stand for a minute's silence for Byrn Morgan, who had been Mayor of Kettering in 1996/7 and a long serving member of Kettering Borough Council.

The Leader also referenced the death of Cllr Mike Tebbutt who had been a long serving member of Kettering Borough Council.										
Remarking on the recent planning decision at appeal, to refuse the application for employment land at Weekly Hall Woods, he commented on the wisdom of working collaboratively with the applicant to find a satisfactory way forward for the future of the site.										
Finally, he advertised the ongoing consultation on NNC's budget for the coming year.										
Crime and anti-social behaviour figures for the year to date

Highways and Pavement Maintenance										
Graeme Kane, Rob Carroll and Jon Sutton attended from NNC and Kier to explain how they approached highway and pavement maintenance, how repairs were assessed, prioritised and implemented, and what inspection and monitoring regimes were in place. Current performance was outlined.

## 2023/080 | Highway restrictions Consultation by NNC

A report was submitted which set out 8 proposed traffic regulations orders across town.

Members queried two of those proposed orders and

## **RESOLVED** that

- a) The proposal to introduce a 5 tonne weight limit throughout the Telford Way Industrial estate be opposed, on the basis that this would prevent most businesses there from continuing to operate and was far too low a limit.
- b) The proposal to introduce a new "loading only" bay in St Andrews Rd be modified to allow residential parking at times of the day when loading was not required by adjacent retail premises, so as to preserve as much of the residential parking capacity as possible.

## 2023/081 | **Precept and Budget for 2024/5**

Members considered the proposed budget as set out in the papers, and it was unanimously

## **RESOLVED** that:-

- a) The budget set out in the papers be approved in the sum of £504,550 and that
- b) A precept of £490,000 be requested of North Northamptonshire Council, resulting in a Band D equivalent council tax of £28.68.
