(max 300 words).	What goes on inside a family determines the opportunities and life chances children have. Children who are raised in a stable, loving, family environment are more likely to have a positive and healthy future. But being a parent isn't easy, and sometimes life can get in the way. Circumstances throw you off course and everything else can take a back seat. A young child caught up in this can miss out on the love, routine and stimulation that are so vital for their future. We recruit, train and support volunteers, so that they can be matched to families referred by other professionals. Volunteers visit the family's home for a couple of hours every week, the support is tailored to the needs of the parents and children and usually lasts up to 6 months. We work alongside parents to help them to regain their confidence, helping them to be the best they can be. There's no judgement, just compassionate, confidential help and support. We only support families that live within the Kettering Area and we work closely with Midwives, health visitors, nurseries and schools as well as housing, Social Care and Health and other Statutory Services

How will you measure the impact of the project?	All referrals are assessed by a paid worker who then assigns the most appropriate volunteer, taking into account the skills that each volunteer brings. The support is then reviewed after approximately 6 weeks to ensure that it is effective and then again after 6 months. We aim to end support after 6 months so as not to create a dependency We are able to really get to the heart of the problem and if we cannot provide the help (because it is too specialist) we can take the family to the service that they need and guide and support them through any process necessary to get that support.

(max 300 words).	Works garden. We are now running an exciting horticulture course. We will need to build an outdoor space to work in that will give students and volunteers space to work in the shade and somewhere to sit in at the weekend when the garden will be used by the local community at Johnny's Happy Place (JHP). This would require some form of floor, possibly decking and a part pagoda part shade or part green roof and part skylights/windows to supply shade from the sun, protection from the rain and with open sides. We would also require a professional body to erect the structure. Rain buts would be installed to catch the water from the roof and a green roof would provide food, refuge and carbon capture. We also need tools, compost, topsoil and other materials, seeds, overalls, PPE, potting benches and equipment for porting on plants. There is a need for mature specimens, trees, shrubs and perennials with an aim to provide food for the school and the local community via JHP. This is also required to complete units of the course, such as pruning 5 hybrid T roses, etc. Through growing our own food we will be saving on miles needed to produce the food We hope to grow food for the students to cook and eat and prepare for the community café at the weekend, where meals are only a £1. There is also a food share run in the mornings at the weekend that many members of the local community have already started to come along and volunteer in the garden at the weekends when the café is open and benefit from this greatly. Not only will it help our volunteers but it also helps to improve the mental health and wellbeing of our students. It also educates young people and other users about the environment, food chain and healthy living.

(max 300 words).	Calls are sent centrally to the next available volunteer wherever they may be. So Samaritans in poorer areas will give the same service as those who are richer but with much scarcer resources. Samaritans everywhere bring their own experiences, including great suffering in some cases, and there are some who know exactly how it is to make that call and want to give back.
	In Kettering we struggle to find the funds to operate and maintain our building. We have a shortfall between costs and income that we cannot meet despite every effort fundraising. Local people do not have as much money to give. A tin shake in a rich town could raise £450. We could not raise that here. On a practical level we would like more fire doors, more security for our building at the rear, improved accessibility, and simply the money to pay for heat and light.
	We do not want to close down because our volunteers are wonderful and provide a lifesaving service. A significant number are disabled and struggle to mount our stairs. We have a blind volunteer. Volunteers with disabilities are very much welcomed by Samaritans. Long term we would like to have a lift but we cannot save for expenses like these as we cannot meet our day to day expenses. These are local

	people giving to their local as well as their national community.

(max 300 words).	To fund the variety of free gift packs we provide to adults diagnosed with cancer at Kettering General Hospital. This would provide our packs for those attending treatment, appointment and hospital admissions on Centenary and Lilford Ward. At The Lewis Foundation we source, package and hand
	deliver gift packs for free to adult cancer patients in hospitals weekly. These are items that patients might find difficult to buy themselves or simply cannot afford – and that brings people happiness and comfort at a

difficult time. For many people in hospital, our
volunteers are their only regular visitors.
We offer a choice of 29 different packs to pick from.
Packs range from toiletries, puzzle books and miniature
radios. Once the gift is received, we then spend time
with people to reduce loneliness. Due to our work with
wholesalers and businesses, one branded brand-new
gift costs £3.60.
How the funded project would work at Kettering
General Hospital:
Centenary Ward - the packs will go to patients
attending treatment or appointment.
We leave a selection of our packs stationed next to the
reception desk. As soon as someone checks in for their
appointment, they can then select a pack of their choice
to take in with them. Volunteers also hand our gift
packs out to patients and spend time talking to people.
Lilford Ward - the packs will go to inpatients.
A selection of our packs is left on the hospital ward.
Patients are given a choice of pack they would like from

Helping to improve a patient's physical and mental wellbeing

All the work we do is focused on improving a patient's physical and mental wellbeing. The best way to showcase how we help improve the physical and mental wellbeing of a cancer patient is via feedback we have received.

Below is an example from cancer patients, carers and hospital staff:

"After coming round from my mastectomy at Kettering General Hospital I had one of The Lewis Foundation packs by my bed. To say it was a lovely surprise would be an understatement. I was so touched (and still am) at receiving such a thoughtful gift. My pack contained shower gel, deodorant, lip balm, sanitary towels, underwear and other useful products. Whilst having chemotherapy, the selection of packs available, were so useful. Some contained quiz books/reading material others contained blankets and so much more. I have recently been to Northampton General Hospital in readiness for radiotherapy. I was so pleased to see a shelf full of packs for people to help themselves too. I would like to say a huge "thank you" to The Lewis Foundation, and I will never forget the joy I felt when I woke up to see the pack you left me."

"The care packs from The Lewis Foundation are absolutely amazing. To have something to take your mind of the treatment and the worry is great. I was lucky enough to not have a pack due to being admitted and I only had them on my chemo days. I also had letter in one pack and it was so lovely.

Thank you doesn't seem enough, but you are all amazing!!"

"I work as a Macmillan sarcoma nurse specialist looking after patients with soft tissue and bone cancer called sarcoma. Often treatment is complex and requires lengthy inpatient stays for patients needing different treatments due to their cancers.

The treat bags offer something for everyone which are so inclusive and well thought out.

My team and I have been able to deliver a variety of these wonderful gifts to patients on wards, in accident and emergency, patients awaiting medical procedures, nearly admitted patients awaiting a bed, patients receiving, chemotherapy and radiotherapy.

The feedback has always been so positive which is a delight to hear particularly when patients are feeling not themselves and need extra support and care.

Giving these treat bags, I've witnessed patients feel emotionally stronger. More empowered.
Felt someone really cares, it's not just about hospital care and procedures, feeling that care more personalised.

Offers Financial assistance as some patients may not be able to afford these little luxuries.
Facilitates communication amongst patients having care and treatment in a ward bay.
It's amazing how dropping off hand care bags got 4 male patients chatting about skin care!!
Patients feel equal and other needs are met like reducing boredom, allow a variety of activities to help pass time and strengthen resilience. Makes people feel that bit special, the excitement and anticipation of opening a gift, is fun!!
Also reduces burden for carers and family members knowing their loved one is being looked after.
I feel as a health care professional, we could do more to help but sadly with hospital funds being non-existent for such necessities for patients, it does get very frustrating.

I feel incredibly humbled with a sense of job satisfaction
and reward seeing such positive responses from
patients receiving such treats.
I wish to convey my thanks and appreciation to all the
hard working individuals with this amazing charity who
make this happen. I understand team are so committed
and dedicated to helping patients in a clever way. It's

	However, we have been able to calculate:
	It costs on average £3.04 to provide the contents of each gift pack.
	The gift pack for the items, label on the front of the pack, newsletter that goes inside and pack of hard-boiled sweets costs 56p per pack.
	The total average pack price is £3.60 per pack including VAT.
	At present we are providing 80 gifts per month for adult cancer patients.
	This costs £288 per month and £3456 over the course of 12 months.

(max 300 words).	Southfield Farm Marsh Nature Reserve is part of a Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI) and the largest area of spring- fed marshland in Northamptonshire. It is a very rare habitat that survives on the south-eastern corner of Kettering, crossed by the A14 and right next to the railway line. The Wildlife Trust for Beds, Cambs and Northants has maintained the reserve for the benefit of wildlife and local people since 1993. It is always open to visitors. Enabling people to encounter special wildlife on their doorsteps. The reserve supports a diverse community of plants and animals, many of them rare in Northamptonshire. Lesser pond sedge, water forget-me-not, purple loosestrife, several species of dragonfly, and birds such as the sedge warbler can be enjoyed by visitors. The Wildlife Trust strives to maintain the reserve in the best condition for wildlife and visitors. We keep paths clear and maintain fences and gates. A local grazier puts cattle on the site from April to October, which is essential to maintain the grassland.
	However, excessive growth of willow on the site is a problem. Growth of old trees and spread of saplings onto the grassland has a drying effect on the site and, if left unmanaged, willow will take over and shade out the rare ground vegetation.

	Mature willows on the riverbank are beginning to make the footpath impassable. Traditionally such trees are managed by pollarding – periodically cutting back to a trunk at head height which quickly sprouts a mass of new growth. Through lack of resources, willow has 'run away from us' and we urgently need funding to tackle it before the job becomes even bigger.



It rebuilds ecosystems that have previously been modified by human disturbance, using the plant and animal life that would have been present had the disturbance never occurred. Grow Re-Wild will focus on habitat restoration working alongside the ideas and focus of RewildBritain to eventually aid in the reintroduction
	of certain species within the town of Kettering.

Individuals will be supported and aided to undertake wildlife surveys throughout the town identifying key areas for the need of the rewilding projects focus. We will aim to tackle the lack of diversity in the area and the re-intriducaion of species of butterfly, bee and native trees and flowers by taking part in tree seed and flower seed collecting and then using our greenhouse we will cultivate these to then distribute throughout the area accordingly using a trolley and trike so that our service users have full control of the project from beginning to end.

Individuals will then be supported to take part in habitat restoration activities building all forms of necessary habitat and rewilding the built up areas within the town, we will use water test kits to highlight areas in need of help or support within the waterways. We will use pond dipping techniques to survey local areas and the wildlife withing.

The project is needed now because of the lack of engagement and opportunity for people with disabilities, mental health needs, and neurodiversity to participate in practical conservation activities in the Corby and Kettering area. This project aims to provide these individuals with the opportunity to get involved and make a meaningful contribution to their community, while also improving their physical and mental wellbeing. The funding provided will allow us to carry out conservation activities that would not have been possible otherwise, and to involve more people in these efforts.

We have registered as a wild space via the butterfly conservation website and want to progress with this alongside using the rewildbritain ethos and advice.

This funding grants families access to childcare services at no personal expense, as the HAF allowance covers Athena Activities' incurred cost of allowing these children's free attendance. Consequently, Athena Activities is unable to provide subsidised bookable places during October, February and Whitsun provisions, resulting in an expectation for families to finance their own childcare arrangement. After consulting these families, it's evident that this additional expense is financially unviable, particularly when accounting for an increased living cost that has drastically impacted our target demographic. Athena Activities reports a significant trough in booking volume during these periods of HAF unavailability, further evidencing the financial strain that a lack of subsidisation causes these attending families.
