Report Title:-	Additional works to Fencing at Windmill Ave Allotments
·Wards Affected:-	Pipers Hill

1. Purpose of Report

To seek approval for some additional works to be completed at Windmill Ave allotments.

2. Recommendations

It is recommended that additional works, totalling £1192, be committed to the Windmill Avenue allotments, as set out below, and that the cost is met from the community infrastructure budget.

3. Information

- 3.1. The fencing replacement works at Windmill Avenue allotments were completed in late June and some positive publicity has bene generated.
- 3.2. On completion of the work, it became clear that two further elements would be advisable
 - a) Gravel boards fitted to the foot of the new fencing, to stop soil escaping onto the footpath from the allotment site
 - b) A half height fence at the entrance to the allotment site to replace a wooden fence which had rotted separating the nearest allotment from the entrance path.
- 3.3. Quotes were obtained from the contractor this extra work and he has quoted £1486.66 plus VAT, comprising

Gravel boards £972Half height fence £294Skip £220

3.4. The Allotment Association will pick up the cost of the half height fence so the total charge for the gravel boards will be £1192 plus VAT.

4. Consultation and Engagement

Local allotment association officials were party to the discussions about the need for gravel boards and a half heigh fence and were in agreement that they ought to be provided.

5. Finance, Legal and Resource Implications

- 5.1. The costs to date of the fence replacement works is £15990, which is being met from the allotments cost centre (£10,000) and the community infrastructure cost centre (£6000).
- 5.2. Any further spending can only come from the community infrastructure cost centre. Currently, £178 has been spent, with a total commitment of £17000 for the rest of this year against it. It could therefore bear this additional £1200 cost whilst leaving a small amount remaining.
- 5.3. It does not make sense to seek competitive quotes of this work, given the contractor's knowledge of what needs to be done, to a site they are now familiar with.
