1	<p>Introductions and apologies</p> <p>No apologies</p>
2	<p>Review of Initiatives during 2024</p> <p>The principal works to allotments during 2024 were reviewed</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">a) Fence replacement at Northfield Avenue – completed in February 2025 by Dave Deacon fencing at a total cost of £6200, including the planning application fee and the cost of a banner which can now be re-used on other schemes. This has been a cost effective improvement to the site.b) Brook clearance at South End allotments – by Ferndale Arboriculture at a cost of £2400. This had made a significant difference to the site, to the brook’s functionality and to sight lines across the allotments.c) Love Wildlife grants at South End Allotments.<ul style="list-style-type: none">a. Night garden - Butterfly Moth and Bat enrichmentb. Nesting bird habitatsThese two projects were substantially underway, having been delayed by illness. Andy to send over photos of completed works to Martin for wider promotion. <p>Southfield School had cleared their boundary with South End Allotments of overgrowth and spreading trees, following successful contact last year.</p> <p>There had also been some legal costs in getting the allotments registered with the Land Registry under KTC’s name.</p> <p>Overall, the total works had come in within budget for the year.</p>

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<p>3</p>	<p>Outstanding actions</p> <p>a) Clearance of land at Scott Rd – there had been no joy with Probation but in the meantime, the KAA had been approached by someone interested in taking a lease for the whole of the former small holding site. It was</p> <p>AGREED that Russell and Martin would meet to assess how realistic the offer was and whether it was worth taking further.</p> <p>b) Flailer deployment at southern end of South End Allotments – Claire had successfully secured a commitment from Leicester Housing Association to clear the boundary with their property, and to dispose of material dumped onto the allotment land. Once this was done, it would be possible to get a flailer in to clear the land and return it to productive use. AGREED to address once LHA had cleared the land.</p>
<p>4</p>	<p>Priorities for 2024/5</p> <p>Several priorities were discussed;-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- New pedestrian gate (and possibly adjacent fending panels) at Northfield Avenue in the style of that already done. A reserved matters planning application would be needed for the gate design, .- Creation of additional hardstanding for parking at South End Allotments .- Fencing along the Margaret Rd frontage of the Margaret Rd allotments – up to 200 metres of fencing – which had been the subject of a several break-ins recently. <p>AGREED to explore costs and potential contractors in more detail for all three projects and submit to Finance Committee in due course.</p>
<p>5</p>	<p>Seed exchanges in 2025</p> <p>KAA would welcome sponsorship, as in 2024, from the Town Council, for their annual meeting and seed exchange on 19th September. The Town Council would also check with Groundwork and the Nature Group to see what they were planning.</p> <p>An event in Northampton called Seedy Saturday was brought to the meeting’s attention and it was agreed that this was a possible model for an event in Kettering.</p>

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6	AOB It was noted that insurers were making it difficult to keep bees on an allotment and that a £50 additional fee was being sought to do so.
