1. Purpose of Report

To allocate monies from the ward initiative fund underspend

3. Information

- 3.1. The Committee at its last meeting agreed to use the underspend in the 2023 ward initiatives fund to make awards to those organisations which had bid into the summer 2023 grants award for the voluntary and community sector and not had an award or who had only partially succeeded.
- 3.2. There were three organisations who members scored highly enough to attract funds but which were not supported in full or at all because of the lack of funds. These were

- 3.3. The amount of the underspend is £2350. Members can allocate it to one organisation or divide it between two or three.
