Briefing Notes: Kettering Walking and Cycling Plan

Preparation of the Kettering Walking and Cycling Plan* is underway. Three members of the project team will be attending this Kettering Town Council meeting to update and involve Members, providing a chance for input in a short workshop style format.

The plan once complete will enable North Northamptonshire Council to bid for much-needed government funding to improve the cycle and walk infrastructure in and around the town.

There are many benefits for all if we make it easier and safer for more people to walk, wheel**, cycle or scoot and enable a reduction in car dependency - in terms of climate, air quality, casualty reduction, less busy roads, access to employment and training, physical health, mental wellbeing, social equality and better neighbourhoods.

The project team is being led by Simon Richardson of North Northamptonshire Council with technical support from WSP and West Northants Council (Highways) and public engagement support from Brightwayz social enterprise.

Format of Presentation/Workshop

- The National Picture, 5 mins 'Gear Change' Vision and Background to LCWIPs.
- **Key Concepts**, 5 mins why more roads don't solve congestion, how slower speeds reduce congestion, segregating traffic, changing behaviour, engaging the community.
- Local Findings to Date, 2 mins trip data, draft core walk zone, walk routes and cycle routes.
- Local Engagement Plan, 5 mins online and in person, range of groups.
- Questions, 5 mins see below.
- Workshop, 10 mins Issues and solutions in your ward and over whole area.
- Round up, 5 mins Continue with Commonplace.

Questions to Consider Prior to the Meeting

- Which groups in your community do you think we most need to reach?
- What do you think are the barriers or negativities we will need to address?
- How can we best get others in your community onboard with the plan?
