6	General discussion
	A common theme was the shortage of younger volunteers to continue and expand the work of the various organisations. At the same time, Homestart reported they had plenty of volunteers, so perhaps some learning was possible from their experience. The

early career advantage to young people who could show voluntary activity on their CV was noted, and it was felt that getting some messages across to sixth formers/students at Tresham would be helpful. The clerk would raise this with the Kettering Volunteer Network (KVN). The Lions Club had also developed incentives for volunteering for 14-18 yr. olds in the past.

Attendees endorsed the work of the KVN in its ability to pull together the wider sector and keep them informed and urged others to engage with it.

The wide variety of activities and the overlap and co-benefits between the work of some groups were noted, as a platform for doing more work together in future.

Ideas for a regular meeting venue for the WI were offered and the availability of plants via Rotary Club was also highlighted.

It was agreed that a summary of the discussion in the form of a contact list would be circulated to all invitees and attendees at the meeting, to support continued networking.
